The 2010 Study Abroad Program in Brazil is designed for undergraduate students interested in international relations, social sciences, comparative cultures, comparative politics, world history, and social policy.

It offers formal coursework and lectures by faculty from Michigan State University in English which will be related to politics, social movements, ethnic and racial issues, nation building, and institutions in Latin America & the Caribbean region.

The coursework can be counted toward requirements of majors in Political Science (PLS 352), majors in James Madison College (MC 324C, MC 325), and the MSU specialization in Latin American and Caribbean Studies.

The baroque architecture of the old town is also very representative of the colonial times in Brazil
